Tahoe Adventure Film Festival ready to roll

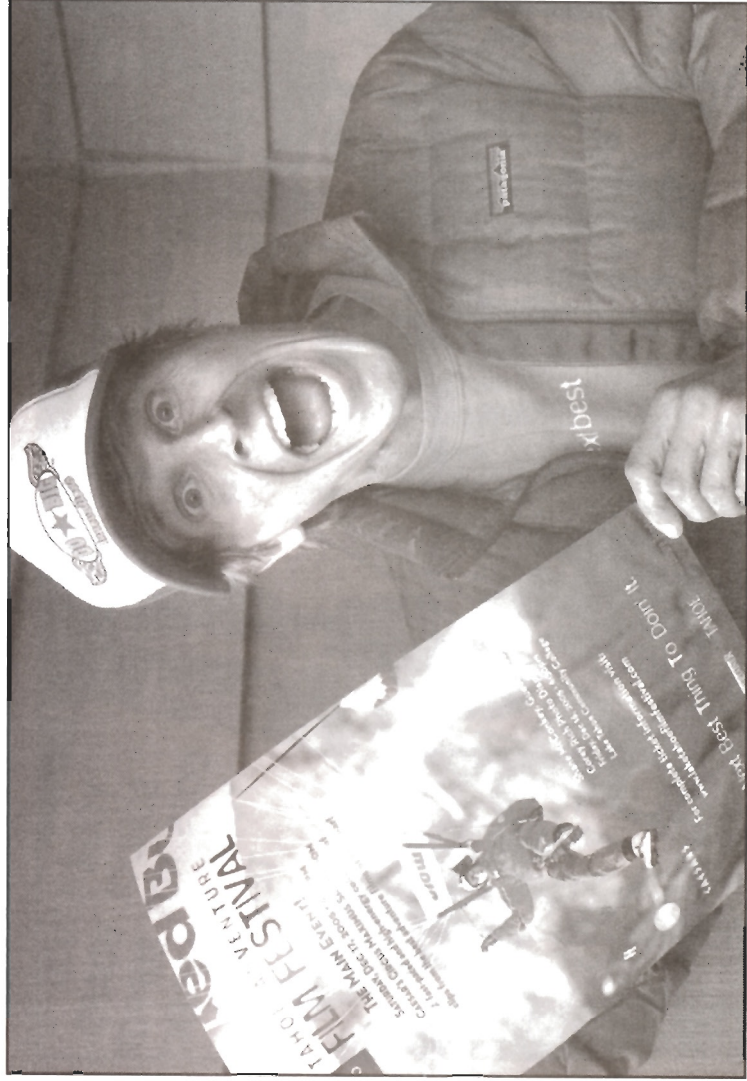
Don't wait until Dec. 16 – trailers for the eight films to be shown at the Tahoe Adventure Film Festival are online at www.laketahoe filmm festival.com.

“What’s unique about our festival is we don’t show the entire film,” said Todd Offenbacher, the man who started the whole deal in 2003. “You see all eight films. They’ve either been pre-edited for our fast-paced format or a segment of the film is out there or it could be a short film. The skateboarding film this year is just an eight-minute film.”

Films highlight different sports, including kayaking, skiing, climbing and skateboarding.

The festival’s format is much the same as in past years, with the first night featuring a guest speaker and screenings the second night. No film is longer than 15 minutes.

Glen Plake, the extreme skier *extraordinaire* with the colorful mohawk, will be the man with the microphone on Dec. 15 at 7

p.m. at MontBleu. Doors open at 6 p.m. A photography display will also be part of that night’s festivities. On Dec. 16, the films will be the focus. Start time is 7 p.m.
